# PRESIDENT'S CORNER A CONFERENCE IN VERSAILLES AND PARIS

On 17 and 18 November, an interesting conference was held, hosted on the first day by the École Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture in Versailles and on the second by the Centre André Chastel in Paris, organised by three architects active in France who have distinguished themselves in the study of railway architecture: Karen Bowie, Franca Malservisi and Annalisa Viati Navone. The title of the conference -Gares, bâtiments, infrastructures ferroviaires entre modernité(s) identité(s) territoriales en France et 1918-1945 Italie: refers fundamental themes in railway history, which represent a decisive crossroads for scholars. Equally relevant is the time span covered: between the two wars and in the years immediately following the end of the Second World War, both in France and experiments and realisations shape - which were the subject of the conference - with leading figures in both countries.

The use of the terms modernity and territorial identity in the title fully expresses the meaning of the French meeting. Exploring the many aspects of architecture, railway the speakers focused on the main moments modernisation such as the entry of electrification, the use of concrete and creation of new construction standards. The conference then reflected on the concept of stations as nodes and as generators of mobility: places of connections able to change everything around them thanks to the new centrality established and to relaunch and multiply more advanced modes of mobility systems. Such a reconstruction very accurately reflects the historical moment and its cultural and economic climate addressed by the conference in an increasingly European perspective. The scientific results confirm the usefulness of comparative logic thanks to interventions that ranged over many specific cases on the two sides.

## COLLOQUE - LES INAUGURATIONS DES LIGNES FERROVIAIRES TRANSFRONTALIÈRES EUROPÉENNES ET LEUR COMMÉMORATION (XIXE - XXE SIÈCLES)

Between 30 November and 1 December, the seminar "The Inaugurations of the European crossborder railway lines and their Commemoration (19th-20th century)" was held at the CEDIAS - Musée Social de Paris. This conference organised by the Rails et Histoire association opened with a scientific framing of the subject by Arnaud Passalacqua, chairman of its scientific committee, where he presented how the idea of an event on this topic arose the previous March following an

interesting discussion and carried out by Michèle Merger, honorary president of our International Railway History Association.

The main feature of the inaugurations was then presented: being a complex and multifaceted event. Underlying the singular phenomenon there is the moment of ceremony but also a project behind it, a meaning (both local and international) and also a set of social practices.

This conference, rich in both topics and interactions, brought together scholars from 4 different European countries, and among them several IRHA members.

Ana Cardoso de Matos (Universidade de Évora) presented the inaugurations of lines between Portugal and Spain as seen and celebrated by different Portuguese newspapers. And how these newspapers, in particular the *Gazeta dos Caminhos de* Ferro had important relationships with the engineers of the time who were also called upon as editors.

Henry Jacolin (honorary president of the IRHA) questioned contradicted the image ofthe celebration as necessarily cheerful, and rather presented it as a moment of showcasing power relations by addressing the Lemberg-Czernowitz-Iaşi line and its cold "inauguration without approval". In the same panel Federico Meneghini Sassoli (Università di Pavia) outlined how in the Italian part of Austrian the Empire the same inauguration could have a profoundly different meaning depending on the environment in which it was presented. He also traced the case of a "missing celebration" during the opening of the Bozen- Verona line.

The conference concluded with a roundtable discussion chaired by Jean-Pierre Williot (Université d'Artois) and attended by Christophe Bouneau (Université Bordeaux Montaigne), Michèle Merger (honorary president of the IRHA), Nicolas Steinmann (CFF, Infrastructure, gestion des projets Région Ouest) and Laurent Tissot (Université de Neuchâtel).

# THE IX RAILWAY HISTORY CONGRESS HAS BEEN CELEBRATED

The IX Congress of Railway History was held in Mataró on 25th, 26th and 27th October with the participation of several dozens of participants. Take a look at the congress proceedings HERE.

The Congress was inaugurated by Miquel Ángel Vadell, First Deputy Mayor of Mataró, accompanied by Magda Pinheiro, president of ASIHF, at the time, and Alfonso Herranz, copresident of the congress. Carles Sudrià i Triay gave the keynote lecture "Discovering the paths of the industrial era. Homage Pere Pascual", a highly emotive act in which recalled the professional trajectory human of this great historian, who was the first president of ASIHF. At the end of the event, the four members of the panel presented his widow, Isabel, with a plaque in memory of the tribute.

In the end of the first day a tribute to Horacio Capel was made too, his contributions to railway geography was highlighted. After two days and a half full of presentations and discussions, David Bote Paz, Mayor of Mataró City Council, closed the congress.

# WITH CHINA'S HELP, INDONESIA LAUNCHES SOUTHEAST ASIA'S FIRST BULLET TRAIN

Indonesia has launched Southeast Asia's first-ever bullet train, a high-speed rail line that will connect two of its largest cities (Jakarta-Bandung).

The \$7.3 billion project, part of China's <u>Belt and Road</u> infrastructure initiative and largely funded by Chinese state-owned firms, **opened to the public on October 2**, **2023**.

The ceremony was held at the Halim railway station in the capital Jakarta,

attended by President Joko Widodo and First Lady Iriana as well as several cabinet ministers.

The 86-mile (138-kilometer) high-speed rail line, officially named WHOOSH, runs on electricity with no direct carbon emissions and travels at a speed of roughly 217 miles per hour.

The year 2023 was marked by the spread of artificial intelligence into all areas of our lives. The history of the railways has also been brought up to date, with the launch of the **first ChatBot** (in French) on the history of the railways in France: a way of making both data (the chronology of the construction of the network, for example) and contemporary debates or areas less familiar to train fans, such as design, even more accessible.

The image you'll be "chatting" with is that of an emblematic railcar from the 1960s, 251 of which were produced to run on rural lines. It was nicknamed the "Picasso" because of its high driving position, which, according to malicious tongues, gave it a crooked nose... like a portrait signed by the worldwide known painter.





### HERITAGE DAYS, RAILWAY DAYS.

On 15, 16 and 17 September 2023, over 200 railwayrelated events were included in the "European Heritage Days" programme in France.

These included open days at workshops and production sites, such as railway stations, and architectural tours. 50 railway heritage associations joined programme, welcoming the public or exhibiting historic railway vehicles in stations, not to mention numerous special trains. All in all, 60,000 people took the opportunity to discover the railways of today, the jobs of railway workers and the history of rail travel. This success demonstrates the public's interest in "living" heritage and the transmission of know-how. All year round, a dedicated website allows people to discover and even remotely visit railway heritage in 3D.



# DB MULTIMEDIA EXHIBITION ON THE CONDITION OF JEWISH RAILWAY WORKERS UNDER THE NATIONAL SOCIALIST REGIME

October, 17, 2023 - January, 28, 2024

Who was Fritz KITTEL?

This question was posed by the writer Esther DISCHEREIT. The Deutsche Reichsbahn agent hid her mother Helga and her sister Hannelore ZACHARIAS during the National Socialist period, and provided them with false papers. He was one of the few people who helped the two women survive the Holocaust. In 2019, Esther DISCHEREIT, with the help of the Deutsche Bahn DB Historical Collections, was able to track down members of the KITTEL family in Heringen, starting by the grandson, Peter KITTEL.


